Dr. Kritee Gujral is an economist at VA Palo Alto, Instructor (Affiliated) at Stanford University, School of Medicine, and Research Scientist at Stanford's Center for Responsible and Effective AI Technology Enhancement (CREATE).

Dr. Gujral received a Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Florida and completed a post-doctorate in Health Economics at the University of Washington. Dr. Gujral has prior experience working as an economics consultant at Ernst & Young, Economics Instructor at the University of Florida, and as research analyst in policy and internationally-focused non-profits.

Dr. Gujral has expertise in evaluating programs and policies using advanced statistical modeling and causal inference methods, including machine learning methods. Her research interests broadly span health economics, health technology, online markets, and applied econometrics, with specialized interests in mental health and suicide prevention, telehealth, and health disparities. In recognition of the policy impact of her work, Dr. Gujral won the VA National Best Research Paper Award in 2022, VA Pacific Region Early Career Award in 2023, and VA National Career Development Award in 2024. Her high-impact findings have been highlighted to the U.S. Congress and in the press on several occasions.
