She is also interested in how the consequences of maternal incarceration differ from those of paternal incarceration in shaping child and family wellbeing. She has conducted research with the Vera Institute of Justice and the National Institute for Criminal Justice Reform, and she currently works with Dr. Sarah Brayne.
