Ian Chua, MD, MHPE, MBA is a bicoastal pediatric hospitalist and clinical associate professor of pediatrics at Stanford Children's Health (Palo Alto, CA) and Children's National Medical Center (Washington, DC). He completed his residency at Stanford Children's with concentrations in medical education and quality improvement. He obtained his Masters' in Health Professions Education at University of Illinois in Chicago. He currently co-directs the Quality and Leadership Training (QUILT) program in the department of pediatrics as well as the PHM Leadership Rotation. He also directs the ACGME Fellows' Common Core Curriculum, the PHM Fellowship Medical Education Pathway, and the Pediatric residency medical education pathway at Children's National Medical Center. His interests have been in educational scholarship and professional development of transitional learners including junior faculty. Nationally, he has been involved in shaping the national PHM fellows' conference and is the current co-chair for the AAP SOHM Emerging Leaders Conference.
