Carley leads efforts to foster a campus culture of respect, inclusion, and well-being. Her work focuses on developing engaging, research-based education and prevention programs that help students, staff, and faculty navigate complex topics such as sexual harassment, sexual misconduct, and discrimination based on sex, gender identity, sexual orientation, race, color, national origin, or shared ancestry.

Carley coordinates a talented team that designs and delivers training, outreach, and initiatives aimed at promoting positive sexual citizenship, preventing harm, and ensuring compliance with federal and state-mandated education requirements. Whether creating interactive workshops, helping manage large-scale online training programs, or consulting on sensitive cases, she takes an evidence-based approach to building a safer and more equitable campus.

In addition to leading education efforts, Carley collaborates closely with campus partners, serves as a key resource on prevention education, and represents the SHARE Title IX and Title VI Office in university-wide initiatives.
