Research Overview

My research combines ethnographic fieldwork, interviews, focus groups, survey methods, and spatial analysis to examine how Indigenous peoples and rural communities navigate environmental change across North America. Working in close partnership with Tribal Nations, community-based organizations, and policymakers, I develop community-engaged, participatory, and mixed-methods approaches to study the intersections of land stewardship, climate adaptation, and environmental justice. This work contributes new theory on the moral and relational dimensions of human-environment interactions, advancing scholarly understanding of how diverse cultural values shape environmental governance and climate resilience.
