Jean-Pierre Dupuy is Professor Emeritus of Social and Political Philosophy, Ecole Polytechnique, Paris and Professor of French and of Science, Technology, and Society, Stanford University, as well as Professor by courtesy of Political Science. He is a member of the French Academy of Technology, a spinoff of the Academy of Sciences, and an honorary member of the Conseil Général des Mines, the French High Magistracy that oversees and regulates industry, energy, and the environment. He was the first chair of the Ethics Committee of the French High Authority on Nuclear Safety and Security. He is the Director of the Research Program of *Imitatio*, a San Francisco foundation devoted to the dissemination and discussion of René Girard's mimetic theory.

He is author of numerous major works, including, in English, *The Mechanization of the Mind* (Princeton University Press, 2000); *On the Origins of Cognitive Science* (The MIT Press, 2009); *The Mark of the Sacred* (Stanford University Press, 2013); *Economy and the Future. A Crisis of Faith* (Michigan State University Press, 2014); *A Short Treatise on the Metaphysics of Tsunamis* (Michigan State University Press, 2015); *How to Think About Catastrophe. Toward a Theory of Enlightened Doomsaying* (Michigan State University Press, 2022); *The War That Cannot Take Place. An Essay in Nuclear Metaphysics* (Stanford University Press, year TBD.)
