TEACHING

Courses Taught in 2012-13:

Film Production 404: Advanced Film and Video Production

Shooting in HD Video, students direct individual projects as well as perform crew roles as cinematographer and sound recordist on films produced in the class. The course examines a range of working methods, formal styles, and aesthetic issues relevant to the documentary, with an eye towards expanding and rethinking formal possibilities and the role of the documentary.

Film Production 406B: M.F.A. Thesis Seminar

This course focuses on the post-production phase of an M.F.A. thesis film.

Film Studies 316: International Documentary

A film studies course that explores formal and conceptual innovation through the study of international documentaries produced in specific cultural contexts. The course traces the history and development of documentary form, as well as the aesthetic and ethical issues found in major theoretical and founding texts.

Freedom Fighters (In Production) DIRECTOR A Co-Production of ITVS

In association with Filament Productions. Funded in part through a production grant from Catapult Film Fund.

A feature-length documentary about a new detective agency in Dallas, Texas, started by three wrongly convicted and exonerated men, with 57 years in prison served between them. They call themselves the Freedom Fighters, and they are looking to free innocent people still behind bars. *Freedom Fighters* is a "documentary-noir" that follows these remarkable men as they wade into complex cases of possible wrongful conviction and try to put their own lives back together after decades in prison.

Informant (2012) DIRECTOR/PRODUCER, TRT: 82 minutes

Distributed by Music Box Films. Produced by Lucky Hat Entertainment in association with Filament Productions. Funded in part through production grants from Cinereach.

This feature-length documentary film closely follows Brandon Darby's turbulent journey from radical activist to FBI informant. Using personal archival footage, stylized reenactments of key moments, footage of the intense protests around the 2008 Republican National Convention, as well as intimate and in-depth interviews with all the major players, the film reconstructs Darby's experiences, while also presenting the dissenting views of those he worked with and eventually helped to imprison.
