CREATIVE WORK

I created new bodies of work including major paintings and a large-scale installation of small paintings on metal panels. Besides significant new additions to the "Library" series (paintings of books) and "Both Sides Now" series (paintings of portions of newspapers in which the images and texts in the back of the paper appear to have bled over to the front), I expanded my subjects to include Weibo (China-based microblog) images to engage urgent social and political issues. With the support of a UPS Foundation grant, I also made new photographs for the project "Cities in Transformation." A group of 10 photographs were included in The 13th China Pingyao International Photography Festival in Shanxi, China.

I had many solo shows in museums and galleries in the US and Asia. My work received critical attention in *The San Francisco Chronicle* and in local news media in China.
